WALKING BY FAITH PAYS OFF IN IVORY COAST

Dear Friends of Galcom,

Two years ago at the fourth Congress On World Evangelization ([November 2024 newsletter](#)) in South Korea we met Brother “Dak”*, son of the tribal chief of the 300,000 Koulango people in Ivory Coast and Ghana. When he learned about Galcom he almost shouted, “My people need a gospel radio station! Will you help us?” How could we refuse? So we promised to send him a basic self-contained 250-Watt Galcom OmniStation FM broadcasting system once a license was awarded.

Dak returned home inspired and soon applied for a radio license. Then, by faith, he began work on a studio building up in the remote tribal homeland. Also by faith, we sent a basic internet ‘webcasting’ system so that he could gain valuable experience legally streaming the Bible in multiple languages plus uplifting worship music out over the internet to smartphone users from the capital city while his FM license was in process.

Then, in the summer of 2025, Galcom donors provided funds to send Dak’s technician Constant for specialized training co-sponsored by Galcom in Rwanda last October. And Dak gained more valuable experience at the dedication of KIOO Radio in Liberia a month later.

In April of this year, we felt led to send an OmniStation and antenna to Liberia by sea so that it could be stored there, ready for immediate deployment to any nearby country when needed, not realizing how quickly God would open a door of opportunity when Dak's FM application was approved just last month! Now the OmniStation can immediately begin moving across borders to his home area after clearing customs around September 8.

All this has happened because our amazing God who desires for everyone to learn about His redeeming love through Christ has been leading by His Spirit, enabling us to respond in faith and obedience. Praise the LORD.

Once the OmniStation arrives and goes live ON AIR, the internet webcasting system now in operation can be augmented by a clear FM signal to reach many of the Koulango and other ethnic groups with gospel messages and biblical content.

When asked, "why not just webcast on the Internet and save yourself the trouble of building a radio station?" Dak exclaimed, "Data is very expensive here and my people cannot really afford it—I need to use the radio to reach them!"

Looking back, it has been amazing to see what God has done in just a short time, and the future for a strong radio and internet streaming gospel outreach seems very bright. Please keep praying for the success of this station.
